## AFFORDABLE RECOVERY FOR WOMEN

It has taken a lifetime to become addicted. It will take a little longer to achieve recovery. Most experts and recovered alcoholics / addicts agree it takes longer than 28 days to achieve lasting recovery. However, *who can afford it?* House of Hope offers an affordable, expertly administered, long-term residential treatment program for less than the cost of most 28-day treatment programs.

### PRIMARY RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

House of Hope offers an individualized long-term residential treatment program tailored for the specific needs women, the program includes:

- Group Counseling
- Individual Counseling
- Relapse Prevention
- Anger Management
- Parenting Improvement
- Family Re-unification
- Domestic Violence
- 12-Step Meetings
- Employment Counseling
- Community Re-involvement

Our mission is to help women regain dignity and learn how to live productive lives without alcohol or other mind-altering substances.

Women live in a home environment, share common household chores, and prepare and participate in daily family-style sit down meals.

## ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING

Incarceration does not work. Over 50% of the California Jail & Prison sentences are associated with alcohol and drug related offenses. Much of the recidivism and trauma to the family can be stopped if women are provided recovery treatment while serving their sentence.

House of Hope is licensed and certified by the California Department of Alcohol & Drugs Programs and a Los Angeles County Proposition 36 Residential Treatment provider.

House of Hope will work with your attorney, court and probation or parole officer to assure compliance with terms of your sentence.

If you are court ordered to a Residential Diversion Program for all or part of your sentence, you will participate in all aspects of House of Hope's Primary Residential Treatment Program. In addition, you will be subject to periodic drug/alcohol testing in accordance with your court ordered schedule or our own random testing. Honest reporting of compliance with provisions of your sentence will be provided to the court, probation/parole officer or your attorney as may be required as terms of your alternative sentencing to House of Hope.

If required, a representative of House of Hope may appear in court with you. Not as Legal Counsel, but as witness to your progress at House of Hope.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for admission to either our Primary Residential Program or our Alternative Sentencing Program, a candidate must;

- Be female, between 18 and 64 years of age.
- Have a sincere desire to stop drinking and using.
- Be physically able to participate in all aspects of the programs.
- Have no major psychological impairment.
- Demonstrate an ability to pay for your treatment.

The rules of acceptance are the same for everyone without regard to race, religion, color, nationality, origin, or sexual preference.

### TRANSITIONAL LIVING

House of Hope also provides a substance-free Transitional Living community that bridges the structured setting of our Primary Residential Program and Independent Living. The benefits enjoyed include economical housing, the ability to go to work or school full time, and the opportunity to create or re-establish supportive relationships with other women, family members, and children all within a safe and secure environment.

Transitional Living is available to those women who have successfully completed our Primary Residential Program.
